The Floyd County Board of Commissioners, as the “Owner,” is seeking Statements of Qualifications from firms interested in providing design-build services. This Request for Qualifications (RFQ) seeks to identify the most qualified potential providers of the above-mentioned services. Some firms which respond to this RFQ, and who are determined by the Owner to be especially qualified, may be deemed eligible and may be invited to offer proposals for these services. All respondents to this RFQ are subject to instructions communicated in this document. The Floyd County Board of Commissioners reserves the right to reject any or all statements of qualifications.

1. GENERAL PROJECT INFORMATION

It is envisioned that the Owner will best be served by the employment of the services of a Design-Builder firm (DB) for the project.

Full DB services include, but are not limited to, general construction, architectural, mechanical, electrical, plumbing engineering, code compliance review, landscape design, interior design, low voltage and A/V design. DB review meeting to be scheduled every two weeks through design. OAC meetings will be held every two weeks during construction. DB shall provide owner site certification and easement exhibits if necessary pending final scope.

Project Description

Floyd County Jail Medical Facility

The Floyd County Jail (FCJ) is located at 2526 New Calhoun Highway and is approximately 256,000 SF' in size. The current medical configuration for the jail is insufficient in that it provides only 4 medical beds for the entire facility, which is rated at 820 beds. This does not meet Federal Standards nor ACA or AJA Standards, which specify that detention facilities should dedicate at least five percent (5 %) of their rated bed capacity to Medical Beds. This amounts to a minimum increase of at least 30 more medical beds. Furthermore, the FCJ requires additional beds for severely mentally ill and potentially suicidal inmates, who must be under constant observation, and more beds to be utilized for detoxing high risk alcohol and drug inmate populations. This requires an additional 15 beds, which brings the combined total to forty-five medical and mental health beds. This increase in medical and mental health bed space and treatment areas are vital in order to ensure the FCJ Medical and Security Staff can more efficiently observe, supervise and provide highly critical medical and mental health treatment services to the inmate population.

The Goals & Objectives of A New Facility and/or Renovations of Existing Facilities are as follows:

- To provide an expanded environment and additional medical/mental health bed spaces for improved delivery of medical and mental health treatment services for all Floyd County Jail inmates.
- To provide additional resources for our contracted medical staff, to properly carry out the appropriate medical functions and treatment responses for all inmates based on their diagnosis by medical and mental health staff.
- To maximize medical and security staff observation, supervision and interaction with inmates housed in the medical infirmary/mental health unit.
- To improve “Safe Housing” capabilities as related to more appropriate and less populated suicide watch spaces and safety concerns.
- To better prepare jail security staff and medical supervisors to successfully cope with and manage the significant increase of inmates with mental health disorders, to include those with acute drug and alcohol addiction, which can lead to depression and suicide.

- To obtain the maximum number of medical and mental health beds and treatment facilities, while simultaneously maximizing the utilization of County SPLOST funds and tax dollars.
- To design and build all areas and spaces in accordance with ACA and AJA Performance – Based Standards for Adult Local Detention and the National Commission on Correctional Health Care – Facility Standards.

The Principles of modern Medical/Mental Health Jail Facilities design

- **Accommodate basic needs.** A lack of basic privacy can escalate behaviors and present a safety issue for inmates and staff. However, the need for privacy becomes a double edged sword when considered along - side security issues. An adequate number of beds, showers, toilets and sinks must be installed with a careful eye to reasonable levels of security, safety and privacy. New technologies, such as electrified switch glass, offer new options for privacy and control, allowing staff or inmates to switch the glass on for privacy, while still allowing staff to track movement.
- **Create diverse housing options.** A suite of medical/mental health housing options beyond the single cell allows jails to staff for proper levels of supervision and better manage challenging populations. In addition to individual cells, other options may include larger cells designed for two or more people or multi-person dorms. For those at risk of self-harm, crisis cells may include intercoms for emergency contacts, beds without spaces underneath, no hooks or removable items that can be used for injury, and appropriate, non-harmful windows and fixtures. All medical/mental health housing should incorporate “suicide – resistant” cells.
- **Leverage natural light and sight lines.** Daylight is proven to keep people healthy. Jails can provide sunlight exposure through ceiling mounted detention grade sun-panels or other indirect outdoor light. Dayrooms and/or cells can take advantage of existing natural light and use reflective paint colors. Larger windows on cell doors allow officers to see in and inmates to see out, creating additional transparency within a secured environment.
- **Use abuse resistant materials designed to emulate softer, “normative” interior space layouts.** While typical jail design lends itself to isolation and uses harsh materials, hard - concrete environments create noise levels that can disturb those with brain disorders. Softer, more natural environments can have the opposite effect. From choice of flooring and furnishings to how spaces are set up for socialization, a jail environment can either aggravate disturbing behaviors or invoke a sense of safety and calm for both staff and inmates.
- **Provide ample, well thought out medical, dental and mental health treatment spaces.** All incarcerated offenders are constitutionally guaranteed medical, dental and mental health treatment services. Although the jail mission is primarily custodial, jails are increasingly acting as human service providers, and that means a more therapeutic environment and additional staff. The modern jail may include programming spaces for psycho-education groups and medication education, informal education spaces where tables and chairs can be pulled together, and enhanced continuum of physical and mental health clinical treatment options.
- **Design a maintenance friendly “rear Chase” quick access concept.** Secure maintenance support spaces should be configured in and around the treatment and housing areas of the new medical/mental health expansion project. Utilize a “rear chase” concept that establishes the rear wall of the living/sleeping areas as the secure perimeter and place the majority of the plumbing and mechanical systems on the outside of that secure perimeter.
This allows for greater ease of access for maintenance staff as well as a safer and more secure working environment.

Scope of Services

The following is a partial listing of services to be provided/addressed

- Programming Study – The study will identify requirements for the medical/mental health upgrades; assess all existing options as related to existing infrastructure and jail facility conditions; develop concept alternatives; review concepts with medical and security staff; develop a project based on known availability of funds and the selected preferred concept; furnish hard and digital copies of the programming study.
- Site assessments, site master planning, and site design.
- Schematic, Design Development, Construction Documents

- Recommendation and delivery of Construction Methods, Materials and Administration of same including submittal reviews and approvals; construction document interpretation; all inspections for all phases; direct/conduct materials and systems testing; conduct weekly progress meetings, initiate/review all GC - Contractor and Sub - Contractor pay request; and project close out.
- Permitting
- Budget and schedule control

Sustainable Designs

It is the desire of the Owner to incorporate sustainable design and construction concepts in the project where feasible to do so. Operational expenses for the new facility must be kept in line with current expenses.

Project Budget

The project budget (including all fees, contractor contingencies and general requirements) is estimated to be \$2,000,000. FCBOC expects that 100% of project cost savings, including contingencies, will be turned over to the Owner at the completion of the project.

Project Schedule

Although a final schedule has not been established, the Owner has targeted the design phase to begin August 1, 2016, construction to begin January 1, 2017 and for material completion of the project by December 1, 2017. The successful Design-Builder will be responsible for developing the design and construction schedule and coordinating activities to accomplish completion of the project within a specified period of time as approved by the Owner. *(All dates are estimates and are subject to change)*

2. QUALIFICATIONS REVIEW PROCESS

Selection of the DB will be a multi-step process. The owner reserves the right to reject any or all statements of qualifications or proposals.

Step I- Qualification Ranking, is initiated with this **RFQ**, which is issued for the purpose of acquiring Statements of Qualifications from prospective DB firms. A selection of finalist firms will be made by a Selection Committee consisting of representatives of the Owner and possibly a third party representative (i.e., another appropriate Owner representative, stakeholder, etc.). The Selection Committee will receive and review Statements of Qualifications submitted in response to this RFQ. To be deemed eligible for evaluation, firms must meet the following minimum qualifications:

Minimum Qualifications Required

- The firm or its principals are not currently ineligible, debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded from bidding or contracting by any state or federal agency, department, or authority (See Exhibit A).
- The firm or its principals have not been terminated for cause or currently in default on any public works contract (See Exhibit A).
- Firm must have sufficient bonding capacity for anticipated total cost of work (\$2,000,000). Only those sureties listed in the Department of Treasury's Listing of Approved Sureties (Department Circular 570) are acceptable to the Owner. At the time of issuance, all insurance and bonds must be issued by a company licensed by the Georgia Insurance Commissioner to transact the business of insurance in the State of Georgia for the applicable line of insurance. Such company shall be an insurer (or, are qualified self-insurers or group self-insureds, a specific excess insurer providing statutory limits) with an A.M. Best Financial Strength rating of "A-" or better and an A.M. Best Financial Size Category of Class V or larger (See Section 5, A6.a).
- Firm must have a current Contractor's Public Liability Insurance policy, and must be insurable in the following amounts: Bodily injury, including death- limits of \$1,000,000 for each accident. Property damage- limits of \$2,000,000 for each accident and \$4,000,000 for the aggregate of operations. (The Owner reserves the right to require additional limits and/or coverage for actual contract.) (See Section 5, A6.b).
- Firms must have all necessary, valid and current licenses to do business in the State of Georgia (See Section 5, A6.c).

- Firm must demonstrate sufficient cash flow to undertake the project as evidenced by a current ratio (assets/liabilities) of 1.0 or higher (See Section 5, A6.d).
- The firm must demonstrate a commitment to safety with regard to Workers' Compensation by having an Experience Modification Rate (EMR) over the past three years of 1.2 or less (Each of the last three years shall be 1.2 or less) (See Section 5, A6.e).

The Selection Committee will then evaluate the submittals, which have met the above minimum qualifications. Criteria for the evaluation are listed below:

Criteria for evaluation of Statements of Qualifications

1. Stability of the firm. This shall include the documented financial viability of the firm, the firm's years of successful operation, stability of management structure and ownership, active litigation and litigation history, proven ability to consistently gather resources for projects similar to incumbent project in size, type, complexity, and location.
2. Firm's relevant project experience and qualifications, including the demonstrated ability of the firm in effective management of design and construction pertaining to renovation of similar facilities of comparable complexity, size, and function, for Owners such as the State of Georgia and other similarly- structured organizations. This includes relevant experience and qualifications of the firm's principal Design Professional, Project Executive, Project Manager, and Superintendent and recent history of collaboration between the Design Professional and Construction team.
3. Firm's suitability to provide design-build services for the project, including the firm's apparent fit to the project type and/or needs of the Owner, any unique qualifications for the project, current and projected workloads, the proximity of office to project location, non-discrimination policies, and record of addressing public safety, environmental concerns, and special services.

Final DB Selection will be initiated by invitation to selected finalists to submit Project and Fee Proposals. Finalist presentations/interviews may also be conducted by the Owner. The successful DB will be determined from the proposals received and interviews, if needed, by selected finalists.

Total page count of the submittal must not exceed 50 pages with font size no smaller than 10pts. Submittals that include qualifications of more than one firm shall not exceed the page limit. A. Description and Resources of Firm

Identify office from which project will be managed and this office's proximity to the project site. Provide form of ownership, including state of residency or incorporation, and number of years in business. Is the offeror a sole proprietorship, partnership, corporation, Limited Liability Corporation (LLC), joint venture, or other structure? For joint venture entities that have not undertaken at least *two* projects together, each firm should submit its qualifications separately. ownership, including state of residency or incorporation, and number of years in business. A5- Has the firm ever been removed from a contract or failed to complete a contract as assigned? Provide a statement of disclosure to allow the Owner to evaluate any possible conflicts of interest.

A6- The firm, in order to be deemed eligible for evaluation, must provide supporting documentation asserting that the firm meets the minimum qualifications required for this project

- a. Firm has sufficient bonding capacity for anticipated total cost of work and our surety and insurance companies are in the current Department of Treasury's Listing of Approved Sureties (Department Circular 570). All insurance and bonds will be obtained through a company licensed by the Georgia Insurance Commissioner to transact the business of insurance in the State of Georgia for the applicable line of insurance. The company is an insurer (or qualified self-insurers or group self-insureds, a specific excess insurer providing statutory limits) with an A.M. Best Financial Strength rating of "A-" or better with an A.M. Best Financial Size Category of Class V or larger. **Provide** a letter or other supporting documentation from your firm's surety indicating the firm has a bonding capacity of \$2,000,000.
- b. Firm has a current Contractor's Public Liability Insurance policy, and your firm is insurable in the following amounts: Bodily injury, including death- limits of \$1,000,000 for each accident. Property damage- limits of \$2,000,000 for each accident and \$4,000,000 for the aggregate of operations. The Owner reserves the right to require additional limits and/or coverage for actual contract. **Provide** your current insurance certificate.
- c. Firm has all necessary, valid and current licenses (including a valid and current Georgia General Contractor's License) to do business in the State of Georgia. *General Contractor **must** have a valid and current Georgia General Contractor License at the time of submission of qualifications.* **Provide** a valid copy of your Georgia General Contractor license and a Georgia Certificate of Existence or Certificate of Authority demonstrating your firm has registered with the Georgia Secretary of State and is authorized to do business in Georgia.

B. Experience and Qualifications

B1- Provide professional qualifications and description of experience for principal Design Professional, Project Executive, Project Manager, and/or Superintendent. *(At this stage, firms are asked for information on lead staff only, but may list qualifications and experience on more than one lead individual who is qualified and available for proposed project. **If the firm is selected as a finalist, the Owner may request detailed information on the exact proposed expanded team, their proposed roles, and their relevant experience.***

B2- Provide information on the firm's design-build service experience on projects of similar, size, function, and complexity (similar type of renovation/construction and a contract dollar amount equal to 70% or more of the anticipated amount of the incumbent project). Describe no more than five (5) and no less than three (3) projects, in order of most relevant to least relevant, which demonstrate the firm's capabilities to perform the project at hand. For each project, the following information should be provided:

Suitability may include, but is not limited to, the firm's fit to the project and/or needs of the Owner, any special or unique qualifications for the project, current and projected workloads, the proximity of office to project location, and any techniques or methodologies offered by the firm that may be particularly suitable for this project type.

C2- Provide non-discrimination policies and describe the firm's record and methodologies of addressing public safety, social, environmental, or other related concerns.

C3- Provide information on any special services offered by the firm that may be available for this project.
